Report Title: Strategic Plan - Reference Checks

Recommended Resolution:

That Council review the comments made by references and decide on the preferred proponent to prepare the Strategic Plan.

Analysis & Background:

I emailed all the references that were listed in the eight (8) proposals except a few that had only phone numbers. On average they included three (3) references. Please note that some references were out of office and did not reply in time for this report. There is at least one (1) reference per proponent.

To make the process fair, I sent out a list of questions to all and only followed up when requested.

A. Compass Point:

1. Town of St. Marys

Good morning, Denis,

I am providing a reference for the work that Dr. Bill Irwin completed for the Town of St. Marys in 2015-2017. At that time, Dr. Irwin (mentioned as a consultant on your project). Completed a strategic plan review and update for our newly seated Council.

- How well did the consultant understand and address your organization needs?



- The Towns project began with a review of the 2010 Strategic Plan as the first step in the project. In 2010, the Town had completed a comprehensive public engagement to identified key strategic issues facing the community. The 2015 effort began with the consultants walking Council through a process to review and determine if these issues remained relevant.
- Dr. Irwin was successful at this task, and was able to help Council identify what was and was no longer relevant issue facing a small town.
- His approach was different than many consultants. In many cases, a consultant will simply document what Council says and believes. Dr. Irwin was able to respectfully challenge the councillors to make them critically think about the issues facing the community.
- How would you rate the quality of the consultant's work?
 - We were very satisfied with the end product. Rather than having a strategic plan that was nebulous and written at the 50,000 ft level, ours was a nice blend of both. It set clear goals for the Town to work towards in the future, complimented by actionable strategies that were clear and easy for staff and Council to understand and implement.
- Were the deliverables clear, actionable, and aligned with your strategic goals?
 - Yes per the above.
- Did the consultant demonstrate a strong understanding of municipalities and specific challenges?
 - Yes. Dr. Irwin has a unique blend of skills that makes offers him an advantage. He is a former municipal employee, former professor in a local government program, and is now a municipal councillor.
 - For St. Marys, Dr. Irwin was able to listen to Council's conversations, and clearly summarize them into key issue statements that were relevant to the community at that time.
- How effective were they in providing innovative solutions?
 - Very. The consultant was able to look at our community, flag issues that we all said "we have to live with that" and challenge us with the simple question of "why"? They were able to push us to openly talk about these strategic issues and develop creative solutions



- Would you hire this consultant again for future projects?
 - Yes
- Is there anything you wish the consultant had done differently?
 - No we were very pleased with the work.

Thank you for reaching out. We hired EYG for a project with the Manitoulin Sudbury Network for Children and Families, so I am not able to fully assess EYG's understanding of the specific needs and challenges of municipalities like St. Charles.



That said, EYG was enthusiastic and engaged in understanding the Network's needs. However, their approach was somewhat broad, and they faced challenges in addressing the specific, nuanced needs related to supporting children and families across the district. Additionally, we found that their written work could have been more thorough. While the deliverables aligned with our strategic goals, the written materials could have been stronger. 1. Township of Billings

- How well did the consultant understand and address your organization needs?
 - We are a very small, rural municipality – smaller than St. Charles (population-wise) – but Capital Park did seem to have a pretty-



good understanding of our needs. Just as importantly, they seemed receptive, and willing to listen/learn about our specific needs. Our previous plan was okay, but for various reasons we had not been able to renew/update our strategic plan. Capital Park was receptive/sensitive to what had gone before, what had been accomplished, or not, evolution, etc.

- How would you rate the quality of the consultant's work?
 - Their work, both their research and reporting, was very good – solid. Not perfect – which I would not expect – but, yes, very good. Steve, who was the lead, was very receptive to feedback and constructive criticism, which to me, is more important than perfection.
- Were the deliverables clear, actionable, and aligned with your strategic goals?
 - Yes, I think so. We all worked very hard on this – including Steve and Tim (Tim attended our in-person workshop session with Council). So, if the deliverables fail in any way in-terms of actionability or tangibility, that rests as much with staff and Council as with the consultants. I think they are pretty good, though, and they do align well with strategic goals.
- Did the consultant demonstrate a strong understanding of municipalities and specific challenges?
 - Yes, Capital Park demonstrated very good knowledge of municipal mandates, operations, and challenges/limitations, including those at our level (small rural)
- How effective were they in providing innovative solutions?
 - I don't know that they necessarily provided a lot of innovation, or that we really asked for any. They did seem to have a lot of different tools or approaches at their disposal and were open to applying and "tweaking" different things to our needs. For example, Steve was very flexible in creating a citizen/rate-payer survey that met our needs – and in the end, we got exceedingly good response to that, as one important form of stakeholder input.
- Would you hire this consultant again for future projects?
 - Yes, we would definitely consider Capital Park again for strategic planning and similar work.
- Is there anything you wish the consultant had done differently?



- Nothing really stands out . . . perhaps pushed us a little harder in the early stages of our process to stick to our timelines – they were almost too flexible/accommodating. It all worked out fine, but it meant we all had to “knuckle down” that much harder in the final stages. I don’t think that is uncommon, though.

Report Title: Replacement of Pumper 1201 and Financing Options

Recommended Resolution:

That Council authorize the purchase of a new pumper rescue truck from Battleshield Industries Limited at a cost of \$719,000.00 plus HST.

Options:

1. Finance full amount of the new pumper.
2. Use most of the Fire Department reserve as a down payment to lower the financed amount.
3. Selecting a debenture duration range from 10 to 20 years.

Analysis & Background:

With the decision to purchase the new pumper with a purchase price of \$719,000, there will be a portion of the HST that we will not be able to claim back, and therefore will increase the purchase price of the unit to approximately \$731,000.00.

The Treasurer reached out to Caisse Alliance and Infrastructure Ontario for a quick rate quote to get an idea of what we are looking at since this was happening fast.

Caisse Alliance came back with the following rate:

***“We can amortize the fire truck over 10 years, with 2 terms of 5 years for the loan.*”**



Current rate would be 7.02%, with a discount of 1.10% for a 5-year rate of 5.92%.

We can finance at 100% of the purchase cost, not including the HST.”

I have confirmed with Caisse Alliance that at the end of the first 5-year term, the rates would be renegotiated.

Please note, that a 1% tax levy increase represents \$29,239.00

At the beginning of 2024, the Fire Department Reserve had a balance of \$156,618.00. The 2024 budget included a \$60,000.00 contribution, but also a \$20,000.00 withdrawal for the new holding tank and Firehall insulation and washroom upgrades (grant dependent), given an anticipated year-end balance of \$196,618.00.

The Fire Chief has indicated that the next major purchase would be new breathing apparatuses in the next few years, and a replacement tanker truck within the next 5 to 7 years. It is recommended that not all reserves be used to allow for these upcoming purchases and to continue to fund the reserve as well to reduce the need for future debentures and interest costs.
